

EFFECTIVE APRIL 22, 2010:

THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (EPA) IS INTRODUCING NEW REQUIREMENTS REGARDING SAFE LEAD REMOVAL PRACTICES.

THE NEW LAW

“...beginning in April 2010, contractors performing renovation, repair and painting projects that disturb lead-based paint in homes, child care facilities, and schools **built before 1978 must be certified and must follow specific work practices to prevent lead contamination.**”

“The law will require contractors and maintenance professionals to be certified, and their employees trained. In addition, they must follow protective lead-safe work practice standards when renovation, repair or painting activities will disturb more than six square feet of lead-based paint in a room or when 20 square feet of lead-based paint is disturbed on the exterior. Two-thirds of homes and half of the schools and day care centers built before 1960 have some lead-based paint...”
